The size of the rim increases with the size of the car. Smaller cars have rims that are 13 inches in diameter. Larger vehicles have rims that can go up to 27 inches and beyond. Rear wheel drive vehicles typically need rims 2 inches larger in diameter than front wheel drive vehicles.

Increasing the size of the rim enhances the look, as well as the performance of the vehicle. "Plus sizing" is a term that refers to increasing the size of the car rim in proportion to the wheel. Plus sizing gives the driver a better steering response and the ability to handle corners more efficiently. A larger surface area of the wheel comes in contact with the road when the size of the rim is increased.

One of the hottest trends today is for car rims that include spinners. These rims cause an optical illusion. The wheel looks as though it is still spinning when a vehicle is stationary.
